<u>Number - Times tables</u> <i>L.I I am learning to improve my speed and accuracy of my times table facts.</i> Use the games below to practise times table facts: Sumdog Times table challenge Times table assessment Hit the Button https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button	<u>Spelling</u> <i>L.I. I am learning to spell words with the 'l' sound correctly.</i> <u>ABC Order:</u> First write your spelling words in a list. Then write them in alphabetical order. For an extra bonus, write your words in reverse alphabetical order!	<u>Health and Wellbeing:</u> <i>L.I. I am learning to stay active.</i> Create a 10-minute exercise programme for you and your family to do at home. The programme should include short rest times. Joe Wicks' daily PE lessons will keep you active and give you some inspiration for your exercise programme.
<u>Maths - Measure</u> <i>L.I. I am learning to talk about how and why measurement is used in everyday life.</i> Look around your home, especially in the kitchen, for examples where measurements are recorded. Write a record of the examples you find. Remember to list the item, the unit of measure used and the equipment that might be used to measure this. e.g. a bag of sugar, grams, kitchen scales	<u>Writing</u> <i>L.I. I am learning to write a poem.</i> Write a poem about your experiences of learning at home. You could write about your general experience or you could write about a specific activity. <i>Challenge - Use rhyming words</i> <i>Remember to build a bank of key words about the subject, e.g. online, parents, alone, table, sofa,</i>	<u>Art</u> <i>L.I. I am learning to create a piece of art in the style of a well-known artist.</i> Research an artist and do a painting or drawing using this artist's style. Remember to find out some interesting facts about this artist too.
<u>Maths - Measure</u> <i>L.I. I am learning to estimate and measure items and then check to see how close I was - Weight</i> Find some objects which are small in size but heavy, and some which are light but big in size. Record each item and an estimate of its weight. If you have scales at home, you can weigh the items to check their weight. Can you order the items from lightest to heaviest?	<u>Reading</u> <i>L.I. I am learning to explain the main ideas in a text.</i> Draw a cartoon strip showing the sequence of events that have happened in your book so far. We would love to see these completed cartoon strips.
